Pastor Sue's Newsletter Article 2023

I watch the news each day hoping to hear that a cease-fire or peace treaty has been reached between Israel and Palestine. As with all wars, the senseless killing, terrorism, and slaughter of innocent people is horrifying. This war, even more so than the war raging between Ukraine and Russia, has caused the Christian church to respond with pleas for both peace and further violence. Let me explain.

There is a wing of the Christian church that believes the book of Revelation and Jesus' teachings about the end times continue to play out in our world today. The Christian Zionist movement was behind the push to move the US Embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem in 2018.

John Hagee, Texas televangelist and founder of Christians United for Israel, an influential Christian Zionist advocacy group, claimed he had helped convince the Trump administration to move the Embassy by stating that Jesus is coming back to Jerusalem to "set up His throne on the Temple Mount where He will sit and rule for a thousand years of perfect peace."

For many Christian Zionists, support for Israel is rooted in its role in the supposed end times: Jesus'return to Earth, a bloody final battle at Armageddon, and Jesus ruling the world from the Temple Mount in Jerusalem. In this scenario, war is not something to be avoided, but something inevitable, desired by God, and celebratory. (Susan Posner)

What is greatly disturbing to me is that humanitarian aid to victims in both Israel and Palestine is being scrutinized by some Christians who do not want Palestinians to receive any kind of help. They consider the Palestinians our enemies because they are "all" Muslims and part of the Hamas terrorists—which is simply not true. There are Christians, Jews, and Muslims living in both Palestine and Israel. They are not our enemies. Only Satan is our enemy.

As Christians, we follow the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. Time and time again, Jesus ministered to people his disciples considered enemies. Jesus ate with sinners, touched lepers, broke Sabbath laws, talked with women (forbidden!), and told His followers to love one another, love our enemies, do good to those who persecute you. Jesus washed the feet of both Peter, who denied knowing Him and Judas, who betrayed Him. And Jesus told us to do the same to people we would rather not even associate with.

I pray for peace in the Middle East. I pray that both Israel and Palestine will find a way forward to live in peace and harmony. What is happening in the Middle East does not indicate that the end of the world is coming. Only God knows when that will be. If we try to read the signs of the times, we get caught up in what we hope or think is happening, when it is only God who truly knows. I, for one, am content to let God be the only one who knows.

But about that day and hour, no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. (Matthew 24:36)



And here we are at last, the month of November. Giving Thanks for all things in creation in every way. With November, of course, comes the knowledge that December will soon be upon us. That brings us to the church season of Advent. It is a time of waiting and anticipating the birth of our Savior. Advent begins on Sunday, December 3rd and is celebrated until Christmas. Even though it is only November, perhaps we begin thinking a bit about Advent already. Getting ready for how we might observe this four week period spiritually. Planning ahead for devotion and prayer that will draw us away from the busy, busy season to a quiet moment with our God. That settles me down inside and actually makes the seasonal stress less, well, less stressful.

I have a spiritual director named Holly Whitcomb. She has written a book I love called "Seven Spiritual Gifts of Waiting". Until I read her text, I had not thought of waiting itself as a gift. But it is and it has been. Spiritual gifts we can center on with scripture, pray about, and accept our response as the gift of God that it is. I list all seven, in no particular order. Maybe you would like to spend the season of Advent with these gifts as well as we wait, and watch, and get ready.

Gift: Patience Psalm 25. We wait together with God. In what way can you claim waiting in this season a spiritual gift?

Gift: Loss of Control Matthew 27:57-61 Put yourself in the life of the women who were at Jesus' death. They had relinquished all control. What can we learn from this loss in our lives? Perhaps resilience.

Gift: Living in the Present Matthew 6:34 The gift to relinquish worry in our lives. Ask yourself what can you do to accept the words "It is enough?"

Gift: Compassion Psalm 139. We offer hope to others around us as we dwell on being compassionate. A greater learning is how can we accept from others the hope they bring from our living Lord?

Gift: Gratitude Matthew 5:1-12 Gratitude, as we meditate, can turn our obstacles into opportunity for ourselves and others.

Gift: Humility You are a child of God. God gifts you in many ways. How are you using those gifts for others. Can you identify your gifts? Ask someone close to you to help you identify your gifts and how to use them if you do not see them. Pray for that knowledge. God will guide you.

Gift: Trust in God And we return to trust. It is the basis for many things. Psalm 91-1-2 Trust in the Lord. Luke 1:38. Imagine the response recorded here. A young teenage girl uttering that response: "Let it be with me according to your word." The faith was strong and courageous. Imagine. God waits for you to realize the Love you are given. We cannot help but be confronted with waiting. It takes courage to respond with the voice of Mary.

A blessed November and a blessed four weeks to come. Advent. We wait. Jesus comes to us anew once again.


- 1. Mail: Checks can be mailed to the Church.
